Latin Subject Purpose Statement: By studying Latin as BMA scholars, students will be able to make links between the ancient and modern world, understanding that much of our literary heritage originates from the Classics. They will feel confident in making links between Latin words and their English derivations, thereby expanding their scholarly English vocabulary. They will understand how precise use of language enables better communication. They will begin to appreciate the differences and similarities between the ancient Roman and modern civilisations.

In Year 7, all scholars will have Latin for 1 period per week. In Year 8 and 9, scholars will be able to choose Latin as a Brook Bonus Time elective for one session per week.

In years 10 and 11, scholars can choose Latin as an option at GCSE.
